First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 14:21-27 A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them.

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

Responsorial Psalm: I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! I give you a new commandment: love one another as I have loved you. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 13:31-35 A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

I give you a new commandment: love one another.

When Judas had gone Jesus said: 'Now has the Son of Man been glorified, and in him God has been glorified. If God has been glorified in him, God will in turn glorify him in himself, and will glorify him very soon.

My little children, I shall not be with you much longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another; just as I have loved you, you also must love one another. By this love you have for one another, everyone will know that you are my disciples.'






ST THERESE'S TENNIS CLUB (STTC) CENTENARY

ARTICLE FROM THE ARCHIVES: 1924-25: In mid-1924 a few enthusiasts decided to attempt to form a parish tennis club. A meeting was called and the club was launched under the name St Therese's Tennis Club. A number of young men each gave £1 (\$2 today) which was about a fifth of their weekly wage at the time. Horses were hired from John Butler for £1 per head for Saturday afternoons and scoops were also hired to level the ground for two clay courts. A substantial fence surrounding the area was erected. At about this time, the Tramways Board was disposing of its antiquated trams and the Parish Priest, Fr Peter O'Brien, arranged to purchase one for approximately £20 (\$40). This was set up at the eastern side of the two courts (where Court 3 is currently) to be used as a clubhouse. The club became popular and saw 54 financial members.

STTC SEEKING SPONSORS The brief history above is brought to us by the Centenary Celebrations Committee from STTC. The club is using centenary celebrations as an opportunity for fundraising and have written a letter of appeal to parishioners. These are printed and are on church entry tables and are also included at the end of our online newsletter.




