First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13 A reading from the book of Exodus

As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage.

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

Responsorial Psalm: Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! The word of God is living and active; it probes the thoughts and motives of our heart. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

God will see those who cry to him vindicated.

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said 'who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death.""

And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'

ST VINCENT DE PAUL ESSENDON CONFERENCE - QUARTERLY REPORT

Our Conference has been quite busy over the past 3 months from July to September 2025 - our members have undertaken 41 home visits which have assisted 54 adults and 21 children. In the main, the people that we visit tend to be in receipt of some type of government benefit such as Disability Support Pension or JobSeeker payments and are struggling financially to pay utility bills and for food. This quarter we provided just over \$5,700 in food vouchers and Vinnies store vouchers.

On Sunday 12 October we conducted our second Bunnings BBQ fundraiser at the Maribyrnong store. This time around we were blessed with great weather and lots of people from OLN and St Therese's Churches dropped in to grab a quick snack at our sausage sizzle! Even though it was extremely busy all day cooking and serving sausages - our members really enjoyed getting to know one another in a fun way while raising money for SVDP! Our efforts were well rewarded - we raised \$3,078!!


